

Ladhera Sakhun RPA - Key Facts

A 414 km² area RPA was applied for on 21 August 2006; due to conflicted applications, an area of 363.6 km² was recommended for grant by the DMG office in Udaipur to Ministry of Mines, Jaipur on 14 September 2007. The file has been stalled in Rajasthan Government ever since.

The project is located some 70km WSW of Jaipur and was applied for based on the presence of regional albite alteration and small ancient workings. Albite alteration of metasediments is a common feature of the mineralization around Khetri (Cu-Au) and Bhukia (Au-Cu). Previous drilling by the GSI (Figure 3) has returned several broad, low grade copper intercepts with patchy gold (to 2.62 m @ 2.6 g/t Au) and trace molybdenum.

Whilst the existing drilling has only intersected sub-economic mineralization, the significant albite alteration, combined with the known mineralization, makes this area an attractive regional exploration target.

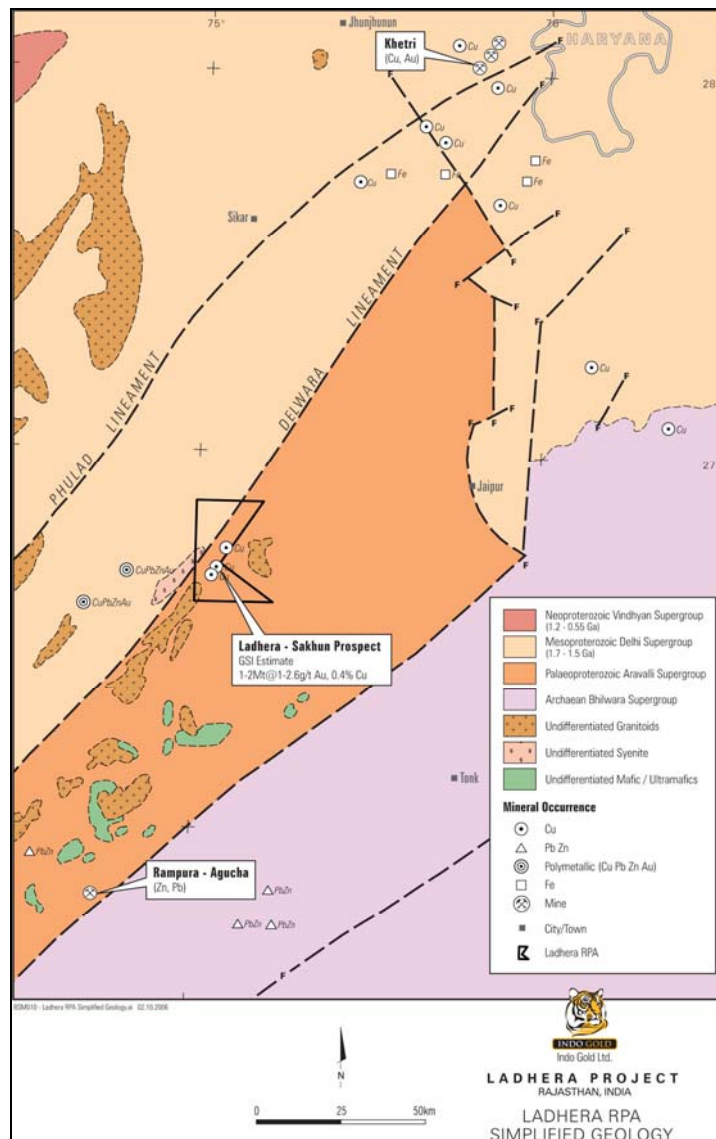
